

■Start No. 1

Classes for Start No.1

M21E、W21E、M20E、MJS、M21A、W21A、M35A 、M40A、 M45A、M21AS、M20A

(Note: W20E and WJS's start area is START No.2)

- \cdot Bus transportation to START No.1
- Please take bus assigned by your start time beside an arena. It takes approx. 20 min.
- · Do not miss your bus. Otherwise, you will be on standby and may wait for the next bus, due to seats are limited.
- Bus No. 0 is non-reserved bus which means you can ride regardless of the start time. If you want to go start No.1 earlier, take bus No. 0. It is first-come basis.
- · Bring number bib, e-card with backup label, compass and so on.
- · Map for warming-up will be distributed at the waiting area of start No.1.
- · At Waiting area of Start No.1, toilet and water are available.
- · Bag drop: Small bag with name tag can be left at bag drop desk. Bag will be returned at the event center.
- · From waiting area to Start Box: follow yellow tape. It takes about 5 min.

■Start No. 2

- · Classes for Start No. 2: See the table of "COURSE INFORMATION".
- · To start No. 2 from Event Center: Follow yellow tape. Approx. 2 km, 60m of climb, it takes 30 min.
- · No toilet available.
- · Warming up area (50m×50m) will be provided around start area No. 2, but no warming up map distributed.
- · Water available
- · No bag drop service

DURING RACE

■Start procedure

- · Clock at the start area displays THE PRESENT TIME.
- · Start close time is 12:10.
- There is forking in M21E. Please check your control description distributed at Start Box 2 (-2 min) and take right map at Box 3 (-1 min). It is runners' responsibility to take right map. The legs order might be different among runners, and you might pass the same controls several times. You should run according to the order shown on the map/description.

■Start Box

Box 1 (-3 min)

Clock at the start area displays THE PRESENT TIME.

When your start time, please activate your e-card and enter Box 1 (3 minutes before you start). At this point your bib number and start time will be checked by the staff.

Box 2 In the second box, you can collect a loose control description for your course. It is your responsibility to take the right one.

IMPORTANT FOR M21E runner: There are 2 patterns in M21E due to forking. You MUST receive control description, which your name and course pattern are designated. It is necessary to take right map according to the course pattern at Box 3 (-1min).

Box 3 Proceed to the box with your class category displayed. Class category (for M21E, class category and course code) will be printed on the back side of the map. It is your responsibility to take the correct map.

From box 3 there is a marked route to the start point. The start point is marked with a control flag

■In the terrain

- · First aid station: Marked with a red cross on the map. The stations will be manned and water available.
- · Refreshment(water) stations (Help yourself to (self-service/ No officials): Marked with cup on the map. Please use cup and DO NOT drink from pet bottle directly due to sanitation reason.
- · Hazard: There might be road crossings, extremely steep areas, large cliffs, or pointed fall trees. Be aware of those hazards.
- · It is the duty of all competitors to help injured runners.
- · The route may pass near settlements / cultivated areas which are out of bound. Possible passage is indicated symbol as below;



■Finish

- · From the last control, follow the marked route to the finish line.
- · At the Finish line, you must punch at EMIT finish units. After the finish line, you will walk to a readout station.
- · Competition map will be collected at the Finish by 12:00. Collected map will be returned to competitors at Event Center after 12:30.
- Finish will be closed at 14:00 for all classes except for the elites and M21A, and 14:40 for the elites and M21A. You should go back to the finish before the time.
- · Go back from the finish to arena by following the tapes. You should use crosswalk with traffic signal. You should not cross other part of the road.
- · On the way to the arena, PET bottled drink supplied by official supplier are available. Do not throw PET bottle away. Take the PET bottle and litter home.

AFTER RACE

■Anti-Doping

Doping is forbidden: "Think positive – test negative". All competitors shall follow the IOF Anti-Doping Code. For more information, please consult: https://orienteering.org/anti-doping/

■Complaints and protests

Complaints and protests must be made in writing (in English), using the prepared form. A complaint should be handed to the Claim Desk at the Head Office (dead line is 15:00). If you are not satisfied with the organiser's decision, then, within the next 15 minutes, you can protest. Protests will be passed to the IOF Event Adviser, who will convene the jury.

■Prize giving ceremony

- · Prize giving ceremony will start at 12:30.
- Elites: The first 6 competitors of M21E and W21E will be awarded. The first competitor registered athlete in JOA receive the title of Japan Champion or Junior Japan Champion.
- · Public Classes except open classes: The first 3 competitors will be awarded.

NOTICE

■General

- · Personal information for the entry will only be used for the event and shall not used otherwise. The name, club, and gender will be published in the program, result and on the internet.
- The organizer holds publishing right of photos or videos during competition, articles and the result of the competition.
- The event will be held on rain or shine but the event will be cancelled when safety of participants would not be ensured. The cancellation will be notice in web site of the event.

■The arena

- · Food and drink are allowed in the arena. You are requested to take all litter home. Do not make the arena dirty, otherwise you are requested to clean the arena.
- · You should not damage terrain and facility of the arena.
- The organizer is not responsible for the lost, theft, or accidents during the event. You should take care of your valuable things. There is no baggage room.

■Competition

- · You compete at your own risk. The organizer is not liability for injuries or sickness occurring either during the competition or during transport to and from the competition.
- There are no regulations regarding clothing. However, full body cover is recommended. Spike shoes are allowed. Outfit for cold weather is recommended.
