Event Venue

Varna, Bulgaria. A district town, situated on Varna Bay on the Black Sea, 469 km north-east of Sofia; a seaside resort.

Transportation

The teams themselves shall organize transport to Varna.

International airports are at Varna, Sofia, Bourgas (Sarafovo). Domestic flights are possible from Sofia to Varna.

The transfer from/to International Airport Varna, Railway Station Varna, Central Bus Station Varna, Sea Station Varna to/from Event Center and transportation to the model event and competition sites will be arranged by the organizer and are included in the entry fee.

Terrain

Short distance - Qualifications and Finals: Broad-leaved forest, with mostly good runability, hilly terrain.

Hilly, deep gullies with steep slpoes. An oak forest, in different sections it's overgroun with hawthorn. There are some single pine and Common locust areas. Mostly good visibility and runability.

Classic distance and Relay: Open, semi-open terrain with sandy and stony ground, An oak forest and a Common Locust forest of varying runability and visibility.

Some areas in the region of Varna are embargoed, see the list below. No prospective competitor is allowed to visit them or to get information about them not generally available. Eight areas with existing maps are free for training.

Rules

The championship will organized according to FISU regulations and the competitions will be run in accordance with the most recent technical rules of the International Orienteering Federation. The organiser declines all liability for accidents, larceny, etc.

Special rules

For the ceremonies, teams are requested to participate in their official suits or training suits. Longsleeves are highly recommended for the classic and the relay. The use of spikes in all modifications is allowed in all events.

Participation

Each federation may participate with up to 12 competitors and 4 officials. Competitors shall be born between January 1, 1974 and December 31, 1984 and shall be:

- a) Students who are officially registered at a university or similar institute whose status as a university is recognized by the appropriate national academic authority of their country or
- b) Former students of the institution mentioned in a) who have obtained their academic degree or diploma in 2001. Competitors from countries with less than 2 000 000 inhabitants or less than 5000 students may be students of technical or secondary schools, provided they have been

attending their establishments for at least two years.

All competitors shall have the nationality of the country they are representing and shall be amateurs as International Orienteering Federation.

In the short distance, each country may participate with up to 6 men and 6 women. In the classic distance, each country may participate with up to 5 men and 5 women. In the relay, each country may participate with 1 men's team and 1 women's team.

The organizers are ready to allow mixed teams in the relay outside the official results if all participating countries will accept this on the first team official's meeting.

Costs

US \$ 45 per day and per person, including accommodation, full board, maps and transportation for model event and competitions. Prepayment 25% by 20.06.2002 FISU Registration fee (for the whole week) - US \$ 20 per person for member countries and US \$ 40 per person for non-member countries.

These fees are valid for runners as well as for the officials. Maximum number of officials is 4 per team. Within the limits of space available we allow additional persons, beyond the limit of 4 officials, to stay with their teams, but at a price of US\$ 50 per day.

Payment

Insurance

The participating countries must have the appropriate insurance to cover travel and participation, as they are not the responsibility of the Organizing Committee nor FISU.

Accreditation

On arrival at the event centre in Varna Free University, the first thing to do is the accreditation.

For each runner, the team manager shall present:

- 1. the passport or identity card indicating full name, nationality, date and place of birth, and including a photograph;
- 2. for students a student card or certificate originating from the appropriate academic authority certifying that the runner is officiall registered for and pursuing a full-time course of study:
- 3. for students starting their studies in autumn 2002: a document proving that the runner has satisfied the conditions normally required in his country for entrance to a university or similar
